

Name correction for *Odostomia* on chiton featured in *The Dredgings*
by George Holm

This is the *Mopalia kennerleyi* Carpenter, 1856 that was featured on the front cover of *The Dredgings*, Volume 49 No. 4, 2009.

With information that was available about local odostomid species at the time, it was determined that the three specimens on the girdle of the chiton were *Odostomia columbiana* Dall and Bartsch, 1907. Upon re-examining the specimens for information being gathered for the above study, Patrick LaFollette, of the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County, California, has now correctly identified the specimens as *Evalea tenuisculpta* (Carpenter, 1864). The chiton specimen was photographed on the seawall at Oak Bay County Park in Jefferson County, Washington.



Photographs of two more odostomids were also sent to Pat in order to verify their identities.

The odostomid at the upper right is *Aartsenia satura* (Carpenter, 1864). It was collected by George Holm in Stanley Park in Vancouver, B.C., in 1964.

The *Brachystomia angularis* (Dall and Bartsch, 1907) [lower right] was collected by Elsie Marshall in Makah Bay, Washington, in 1965.
